Sealed BIDS for "MOUNTVIEW PARK PAVILLION PROJECT, AT 1651 EAST ON FORT UNION BLVD --- PROJECT # CHC.302", will be received by the City of Cottonwood Heights at City Offices, 2277 E. Bengal Blvd., Cottonwood Heights, Utah 84121, until 2:00 PM, June 18th, 2019.

The work includes furnishing all labor, tools, materials, equipment, transportation and services required for constructing the park pavilion, complete; including excavation, all required earthwork, to include general earthwork and site grading; reinforced concrete footings and slab; carpentry, roof trusses, decking material, miscellaneous metal work, metal roof system; stone veneer on columns, 2-inch PVC conduit for future power, and all appurtenant work to complete the pavilion; all in accordance with Drawings and Specifications prepared by the Engineer; Gilson Engineering.

The Engineer's Opinion of Costs for the total project is estimated between \$115,000 and \$135,000

Bid must be accompanied by a Bid Bond, Certified Check or Cashier's Check in the amount of 5% of the maximum bid price, drawn payable to the order of the City of Cottonwood Heights.

All Bids submitted shall be in conformance with the Instructions to Bidders which are included in the Contract Documents; and shall be guaranteed by the Bidder for a period of ninety (90) days from the date of Bid opening.

The City of Cottonwood Heights hereby reserves the right to reject any or all bids presented, to waive any informality in a bid, and to make award or refuse to make award in the interest of the City.
